DMV Select

Fourth Friday Night Celebration

- Councilmember Austin reported on a proposed event "Fourth Friday" to bring visitors to town and increase business, seeking consensus from Council to proceed with planning. Overview included:
 - May-October
 - Fourth Friday of the month
 - 4-8pm
 - Close Virginia St. from Cross St. to Rappahannock Ave. to traffic
 - Restaurants and local vendors would participate
 - Live music
- Council gave verbal approval for Councilmember Austin to pursue project and bring to Council for a vote once

Treasurer's Report

Garth Wheeler gave the Treasurer's report (attached)

- Councilmember Hollberg commented on lodging and meals tax ahead of budget projections
- Councilmember Chowning asked if there was a deadline to spend the first half of CARES Act funding (\$234,000)
 - Roy Kime responded the funds had to be spent prior to December 2024

- Second half of funding expected December 2022

Finance Committee

Councilmember Goldsmith reported

- Budget draft in progress
- Will include new items such as DMV Select and new Town offices

Councilmember Hollberg commented the cigarette tax will also be included

Pool Committee

Councilmember Goldsmith reported

- Meeting with potential contractor with crews and ability to build pool in a shorter timeline than other contractors
- Met with County officials to discuss potential pool funding
 - “Good” meeting
 - Urbanna residents would pay less in any membership fees due to paying both Town of Urbanna and Middlesex County taxes, should Middlesex County assist with funding

Water Committee

Councilmember Smith reported

- Financing for well in process
 - USDA-RW has awarded \$1,056,000 loan
- Engineer-Owner agreement under review with Town Attorney
- Water supply contract with Beth Page campground to be sent to Town Attorney for review
- Cartegraph asset management program will be going live in coming months
- Received final infrastructure upgrade documents from AH Environmental
 - Final cost \$1,000 under original quote
 - Includes assistance with acquiring additional financing through government grants and loans for upgrades
- Councilmember Goldsmith added the Cartegraph asset management program will enable greater efficiency in maintaining and budgeting for water system inventory

Planning Commission

Councilmember Hanson reported

- Commission met February 8, 2022
- Draft of Comprehensive Plan anticipated April 1st
- Street Sign replacement
 - Received 4 quotes MUTDC approved signs, poles, and hardware
 - Less than \$5,000, not including installation
 - Possible online auction of old signs to raise money
 - Possibly sell hardware to antiques dealers and/or Middlesex Metals to offset costs
- UPC sponsored Economic Development Workshop
 - May 10, 2022, approx. 1-5pm at Middlesex Women’s Club
 - Initial reach out to other towns in region and economic development entities has begun

- Sarah Jane Wyatt-spoke in favor of development of Virginia St. Dock/Pier and presented ~~a signed letter from residents in favor of development~~ *72 signed citizen petitions supporting a kayak launch facility [Corrected and amended and copies of signed petitions added to record per Council vote 3/10/2022]*
- Sandy Sturgill-spoke to inform Council of findings regarding easements at Virginia St. Dock/Pier property
- Bill Hight-spoke regarding Virginia St. Dock/Pier property

Councilmember Goldsmith commented committee has been formed to address Virginia St development and other options for kayak launch. All are in agreement for kayak access to creek.

Councilmember Austin thanked Sarah Jane Wyatt and Kristi Anzivino for their work [regarding support of a kayak launch facility at Virginia St]

Councilmember Chowning updated on progress of Blue Water Trail.

- He is currently working on trail sites along 3 potential trails for beginner, intermediate, and expert level kayakers.
- Identified 15 different sites he will research and provide historical context
- Virtual tour that participants will use geo-location on their phones to access information and pictures
- Once that work is complete, movement will be made to establish trails and launch sites

NEW BUSINESS

Sock Burning

Roy Kime presented the idea of celebrating the coming of Spring with a "Sock Burning", when boaters don't need to wear socks inside their docksiders, at the Town Marina.
